In this brochure you will find a brief description of the Carballeda de Avia Nature Trail and the map for the journey, along with recommendations to make the most of this experience. We only ask one thing of you: do not forget to leave everything as you found it. The conservation of

Carballeda de Avia Nature Trail runs through Pena Corneira mountain range in Ourense, one of the largest protected nature area in Galicia, scattered with large granite boulders and restored old mills. It is located in the county of O Ribeiro,

a countryside of extraordinary beauty, where the vineyards that fill the fertile valleys create a distinctive landscape.

These routes take us to the countryside to discover the biodiversity and beauty of our precious natural heritage, and discover the villages, sights, traditions and people that are part of the unique cultural landscape of our country.

Since 1993 the Ministry for Agriculture, Food and the Environment's Nature Trails Program aims to restore former transport infrastructures such as railway tracks, cattle trails and traditional routes, for public use and enjoyment.

The main route from A Veronza starts running along the banks of Gateira Brook through riparian forests alternating with fields of crop, vineyards and pine forests until it meets a road. Here, you can make a detour to take a trip to the town of Muimenta, where you can see a Romanesque church.


