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

**Senda del Duero (Soria, Burgos, Valladolid, Zamora, Salamanca).**

This trail runs along the Douro river for 752 km, where the traveller may find themselves in monumental towns such as Soria or Zamora, natural enclaves such as the Sierra de Urbión hill range or the Arribes del Duero, a rich cultural environment and a delicious gastronomic tradition.

**Senda del Pastoreo (Burgos, Áraba/Álava, Gipuzkoa, Navarra).** A circle route which leads the visitor to those places where shepherding has defined and shaped the cultural landscape, which has been harmoniously humanised. Most of this path, which spans over 400 km, runs through spaces of environmental interest.

**Vía de la Plata (Cáceres, Salamanca, Zamora).** This Nature Trail follows the old Segovia - Medina del Campo railway line, which basically runs along the Eresma river. This trail is great for family walks or bike rides.

**Eresma Valley Greenway (Segovia and Valladolid).** This Nature Trail follows the old Segovia - Medina del Campo railway line, which runs along the old mining railway line 52.4 km long.

**Villabuñedo to Villaseca Greenway (León).** This trail, which runs along the old Palazuelo-Astorga railway line, part of the "Vía de la Plata" railway line. It takes its name from the popular denomination of the old Roman road which connected Augusta Emerita (Mérida) and Asturica Augusta (Astorga). Currently, it consists of different sections in the provinces of Cáceres, Salamanca and Zamora.

**Tren Secundario de Castilla Greenway (Palencia).** This nature trail is nearly 30 km long. It was laid on the old track of the emblematic railway route popularly known as "Tren Burro" (Donkey Train) for its lack of speed. The railway line was built to transport the enormous amounts of cereal produced in this region to Cantabrian ports

## NATURE TRAILS IN CASTILE AND LEÓN



In the following pages, the Nature Trails running through Castile and León are briefly described. Among them, there are short trails such as Esla, Las Merindades, Sayago Crop Fields or Campo Azálvaro; other composed by several stages such as Mirada Circular, Hayedos de Riaza, el Agua Soriano, and some longer trails, such as the Senda del Duero.

**Aqua Soriano, Camino Antonino, (Soria, Zaragoza, Navarre).**

Running from Tudela to Soria, this Nature Trail joins the Ebro Nature Trail, or GR-99, and the Douro Natural Trail. A historical 135 km route which leads us from Celts' settlements through Roman remains and into the Middle Ages, under the watchful eye of the Moncayo.

**Cacabelos-Quilós (León).** 43 km long route which links the French Way of the Camino de Santiago and the Mirada Circular Nature Trail. It crosses the Bierzo plains, a fertile wine-producing land since Roman times and which nowadays boasts the Denomination of Origin (Designation of Origin) El Bierzo.

**Campo Azálvaro (Ávila).** Right in the walls of the city of Ávila (World Heritage Site) starts this 139 km Nature Trails, which follows part of the layout of the Cañada Real Soriana Occidental drover's way.


**Cañada Real Soriana Occidental (Segovia).** This 148 km long trail crosses the Segovia slope of the Sierra de Guadarrama between El Espinar y Ayllón, crossing the counties of Tierras de Segovia and Riaza-Ayllón.

**Ebro (Cantabria, Burgos, Vitoria, Rioja, Navarre, Zaragoza, Huesca, Lleida, Tarragona).** For centuries, the Ebro valley has been occupied by many cultures, and proof of its rich cultural past remains along its course. The Ebro river spans 1280 km from Reinosa to Tortosa, a long course along which its natural and cultural richness may be enjoyed.

**Eresma (Segovia).** Starting in Segovia's paved streets, this 13 km route descends by the slopes of the Sierra de Guadarrama towards the Eresma river valley, until reaching its fertile riverside lands where Hontanares de Eresma is located.
